BOARD MEETING REPORT- Held 3rd February.

- The Board conducted a half-yearly review of the Club's Strategic Plan and determined that the main goals were being achieved in :

Administration and Management- especially the approval for the Constitution and Bylaws and general Club Administration and finance. The Club is applying for a Presidential Citation from Rotary International.

Membership - 6 new Members already and several more in the pipeline. Club is probably at its highest level since its founding years.

Public Relations. - Good press and publicity, excellent new Club Webpage, and very favourable public comment on the Club through the raffle and Australia Day Parade and activities

Vocational and Youth- 3 vocational visits to date, good links to business supporting our membership, community service projects - excellent youth work with Aust.-NZ exchange, RYDA, The Science Experience and RYLA.

International- Outstanding grant and Club effort with Wanaka Sister Club (NZ) to provide \$US20,000 for PNG Mosquito Nets project.

- Expenditure was approved from the Cwith Volunteer Grant of \$4850 on: a frig/freezer for the BBQ ; and a computer hardware package of computer, carry cases, software, warranties, Epson Projector, screen, tripod and speakers. This will be of great benefit when we have guest speakers who need AV support as well as in the Club for graphics, the Journal, Club Records and document storage.

- The working bee at the Storage Container at Kunda Park Football grounds on Thursday cleared all the accumulated timber and junk out to the tip and we can now install some new shelving , steel storage cupboards (from the Grant) and archive our Club records. Thanks to the crew who helped - it was a lot of fun- see the photos!!!!
